## LEARN & UNDERSTAND...

- In Western music there are approximately seven different minor scales the Natural Minor Scale (or Aeolian Mode) is the most important
- Just like the Major Scale, the Natural Minor Scale has 7 different notes whose names follow the musical alphabet
- The  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ ,  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  notes of a Natural Minor Scale are identical to the  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ ,  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  notes of its parallel Major Scale the one difference  $\rightarrow$  the  $3^{rd}$  note of a Natural Minor Scale is lowered by a half step
- The lowered 3rd note is referred to as a minor, or flatted, 3rd both major & minor 3rds are named with the same letter
- Take note: Every minor scale has a minor, or flatted, 3rd
- To form a Minor Triad (harmony of 3 notes), play together the 1st, minor 3rd and 5th notes of the Natural Minor Scale
